Hareby Lane
Back Lane.
On The Castle.

If you are walking or running your dogs in the fields or lanes it's an offence not to pick up after your dogs.

Whilst on the subjects of dogs can you please be aware that in the last few days there have been attempts made to steal dogs.

The Police are aware of these incidents.

Two men in Tattershall tried to snatch a dog from its owner when she was out walking.

A man tried to steal a dog from a garden in Eastgate Louth. It was only because the dog did not have a collar on that the man could not drag it through the gate.

A dog was stolen from Louth on Tuesday.

I am pleased to say the dog has now been recovered.

Please be extra vigilant when walking, running or leaving your dogs unsupervised in your garden.
